MEMORANDUM OF LEASE  
(Commercial 1-C)

This Memorandum of Lease dated as of this 1st day of June, 1983, between Walter W. Goldsmith and William R. Timmons, Jr. (hereinafter referred to as Lessor) and Haywood Commercial Development Company, a Limited Partnership organized and existing under the laws of the State of South Carolina (hereinafter referred to as Lessee).

W I T N E S S E T H :

That for and in consideration of the sum of \$1.00, and other good and valuable consideration and the further consideration of the rents reserved and the covenants and conditions more particularly set forth in that certain Lease Agreement (Commercial 1-C) between Lessor and Lessee dated as of June 1, 1983, Lessor and Lessee do hereby covenant, promise and agree as follows:

1. Lessor does demise unto Lessee, and Lessee does take from Lessor for the term hereinafter provided, and any extension thereof, all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina on the northern side of Haywood Road being shown and designated as "Future Development" on a survey of Haywood Crossing by Lindsey and Associates dated March 14, 1980, revised and recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County in Plat Book 8P, Page 15 and being more particularly described on Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

2. The lease term shall commence June 1, 1983 and shall terminate at midnight on April 30, 2029.

3. The lease contains among its terms and provisions the following: No Liens. All persons to whom these presents may come are hereby put on notice of the fact that the Lessee shall never have the power to subject the interest of the Lessor in the premises to any mechanics' or materialmen's lien or liens of any kind without the express and specific written consent of the Lessor.

4. The sole purpose of this instrument is to give notice of said lease and all of its terms, covenants and conditions to the same extent as if said lease were set forth herein.
