Dear Mr. Vergnolle:

The city of Greenville currently provides sanitation services in the way of refuse collection to various apartments and multi-family dwellings throughout the city through the servicing of metal containers. These containers vary in size from four to eight yards. They may be leased or purchased from a number of suppliers within the region. The city of Greenville does not provide the container itself, but only provides the services to collect the refuse from them. The maximum size container currently serviced by the city is eight yards; however, you may have as many containers as may be needed to provide for the service.

We would currently be in a position to service your needs upon occupancy of the apartment units and would do so as long as the city provides for this service to other apartments and/or similar structures. The 1981 Proposed Budget; however, contains a service charge at approximately half cost to the user. Should this proposal be adopted by City Council in 1981 the cost of the service would be 50¢ per yard collected. It is not known; however, what position City Council will take regarding the proposed fee or any modifications to it. I did feel that you should be advised of the potential change or potential charges at this time.

Finally, in response to your request, it is our current practice to provide the service to apartment complexes and we have the capability of responding to your needs. We would desire the opportunity to review the sizing, location, and placement of containers during the review process. We look forward to working with you and to providing for your refuse collection needs!
