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KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That Clark M. Talley,  
(hereinafter called "Grantor"), for and in consideration of the sum of One (\$1.00)  
dollar, love and affection, - - - ~~XX Dollars~~  
to the Grantor in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents, by  
Delmas Talley of Greenville, South Carolina  
(hereinafter called "Grantee") in the State aforesaid, (the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged)  
has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents does grant, bargain, sell and release,  
unto the Grantee, his heirs, successors and assigns:

One half, the front one half of a certain lot of land situated on the west side of Calhoun Street, in the City of Greenville, County aforesaid, known and designated as Lot No. 25. On a plat recorded in the Deed Book WW, at Page 605 in the office of the R.M.C. for Greenville County. And being more particularly described as follows: Beginning at a stake on the west side of Calhoun Street (corner of property now or formerly owned by Goddard) thence S. 18 W. 43 feet to a stake common corner of lots Nos. 25 and 26, thence with the line of the last mentioned lot N. 76 W. 100 feet to a ten foot (10 ft.) Alley; thence with the line of the said Alley N. 18 E. 43 feet to a stake in property now or formerly owned by Goddard; thence with the line of the above mentioned property S. 76 E. 100 feet to the beginning corner, and being one half the front one half, of one of the lots of land conveyed to H. C. Beattie by Mountain City Land and Improvement Company by deed dated November 24, 1892 (formerly recorded in Volume "YY", page 661 in the Office of the R.M.C. for Greenville County). But was conveyed by deed dated, November the 8th, 1922 to A. E. Boyd and S. M. Sharpe by Margaret Beattie (as Executrix of the last will and Testament of H. C. Beattie), deceased. Said deed now recorded in Book 75, page 509 (in the names of A. E. Boyd and S. M. Sharpe) in the office of the R.M.C. for Greenville County.

This is the same land formerly owned by Ninah L. Talley, now deceased, whose Will appears in probate apartment 461, file 25. A complete list of Delmas Talley's brothers and sisters follows: Lucille T. Sullivan (now deceased), Viola T. Johnson and Clark M. Talley. Lucius Sullivan and Jimmy Mitchell are all of the children of Lucille T. Sullivan.
