hereinafter called Grantors, to J. W. MOODY, Trustee,

, hereinafter called Grantees, (said designations shall include the respective parties, whether one or more, individual or corporate, and their respective successors in interest or assigns).

WITNESSETH: That the Grantors, for and in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars, and other good and valuable considerations to them in hand paid by the Grantees, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have given, granted, bargained, sold and conveyed; and by these presents do give, grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the Grantees, their heirs and/or successors and assigns, subject to any limitations, easements and reservations set out below, the following particularly described real estate, located in the Township of Cleveland, Greenville ~~Transylvania~~ County, ~~North~~ Carolina, to-wit:

WITNESSETH:

THAT, WHEREAS, the Grantor by Deed dated August 4, 1933, recorded in Deed Book 297, Page 101 of the Deed Records of Greenville County, South Carolina, was appointed by J. W. Moody to be Trustee of the graveyard known as the Carson or Moody Graveyard;

AND, WHEREAS, said Trustee has looked after and managed said graveyard and has authorized and been responsible for seeing about all burials within said graveyard;

AND, WHEREAS, said Trustee desires to appoint the Grantee as his successor Trustee so that the graveyard may continue having the proper supervision and care;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Grantor does hereby convey to the Grantee the following tract of land, in trust, to be used as a graveyard and supervised and maintained by the Grantee as aforesaid:

BEGINNING on a post oak near the old Mark Beach Road and runs thence due North 58 feet to a pine; thence due West 218 feet to a Hickory; thence due South 58 feet to an iron pin; thence due East 218 feet to the BEGINNING. Said tract known as the Carson or Moody Graveyard.
