William Headen to Anthony Beverly

This Indenture made this fourth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty six and in the tenth year of the Independence of the united States of America Between Mr. William Headen of the one part and Anthony Beverly both of the District of Ninety six of the one part Witnesseth that the said William Headen for and in Consideration of the sum of twenty five pounds Sterling money to him in hand well and truly paid at and before the sealing & Delivery of these presents by the said Anthony Beverly by the Receipt whereof the said William Headen doth hereby acknowledge and from every part and parcel thereof do acquit and discharge the said Anthony Beverly his heirs and assigns and for divers other good causes and Considerations hereunto moving have Granted Bargained, Alien, Enjoyned and confirmed and by these presents do Grant, Bargain sell, alien, Enjoyn and Confirm unto him the said Anthony Beverly his heirs and assigns forever all that parcel or tract of Land lying and being in the District of ninety six and Greenville County and Little fork of Runy River Originally granted to myself by the Honourable William Moultrie Esquire on the fifth day of December Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and eighty five as by a plat annexed to the said Grant will more fully appear, containing one hundred acres be the same more or less Together with all and singular the Houses, outhouses, Ways, Waters, Watercourses, Paths, Passages, Trees, Fences, Enclosures, Hereditaments, and Appurtenances whatsoever to the said parcel or tract of Land in anywise belonging or in anywise appertaining and the Reversion and Reversionary Remainder and Remainders Rents, Issues, and Profits, thereof and every part and parcel thereof and all the Estate, Right, Title, Interest, Claim and Demand whatsoever both in Law and Equity of the said William Headen of in and to the said premises and of in and to every Part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said parcel or tract of Land and all and singular other the premises above mentioned with the Appurtenances unto the said Anthony Beverly

and his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Anthony Beverly his heirs and assigns forever, and Lastly the said William Headen for himself and his heirs the said tract or parcel of Land and all and singular the premises above Granted with their appurtenances unto the said Anthony Beverly and his heirs against all persons whatsoever shall and will Warrant and forever defend.
