

This Indenture Made this day of January one thousand seven hundred and eighty eight and in the twelfth year of American Independence Between Hugh Moore of the State of South Carolina and Abbeville County of the one part, and Robert Prince of Greenville County of the other part, Witnesseth that for and in consideration of sum forty pounds Sterling to him in hand paid by the said Robert Prince at and before the sealing and Delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath Granted, bargained and sold, aliened, conveyed, conveyed and confirmed unto the said Robert Prince a certain tract of land lying, situate and being in the County of Greenville containing two hundred & two acres, Beginning at a stake, thence S 00° W 92 poles, thence N 10° E 30 poles, thence N 65° E 47 poles, Princes Corner, thence with his line S 22° E 27 1/2 poles, thence with his other line S. 00° E 25 Chain 50 links Stake, thence S 3° E 10 Chain 23 L to the beginning, Surveyed by James Seaborn the 4th day of May 1788 as will appear in Location Office Ninety six District side of Saluda River and by Record in Surveyor Generals office

and Granted to him in the Secretarys office in Grant Book LL page 44 the patent containing 340 acres and Granted to the said Hugh Moore bearing date the 5 day of June 1786 of which said patent the 202 acres is part Reference being had to the original may more fully appear, Together with all one Woods Water courses, mines and minerals, Hereditaments and Appurtenances of or into the said land belonging or appertaining: To have and to hold to the said Robert Prince his heirs and assigns forever, with all Rights ^{Estates} Tithes, ~~and profits~~ Reversion and Reversions Remainder and Remainders of all & singular of or containing to the above mentioned premises, Granted or intended to be Granted, and the said Hugh Moore doth Covenant and agree, himself his heirs and assigns with the said Robert Prince his heirs and assigns, that he was and now is invested with a good and lawful Title to the said premises, and further the said Hugh Moore for himself his heirs and assigns doth engage forever to warrant and defend the said premises above mentioned against all claims and demands of all persons whatsoever to the said Robert Prince himself his heirs and assigns In Witness whereof the said Hugh Moore hath hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year first above written
