To have and to hold the said plantation or tract of two Hundred acres more or less as aforesaid with every the premises & appurtenances thereunto belonging herein before Granted Released and Conveyed unto the said George Tubb his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper and absolute use and behoof of the said George Tubb his heirs and assigns and he the said John Tubb doth hereby for himself his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns Covenant promise and agree to and with the said George Tubb his heirs and assigns in manner and form following that is to say that the said John Tubb now is and until the Execution of these presents stand Seized of a good sure perfect and Indefeasible estate of Inheritance in fee simple of and in all the aforesaid plantation or tract of two hundred acres more or less with the premises and appurtenances without any manner of Condition Trust mortgage Judgment Execution or Incumbrance whatsoever to utter or Determine the same and also that the said George Tubb his heirs and assigns shall and may from time to time and at any times hereafter Peaceably and Quietly have and hold use occupy possess and enjoy the said plantation or tract of two hundred acres of land more or less with every the premises and appurtenances thereunto belonging without any manner of Trouble Hindrance molestation Interruption or Denial of him the said John Tubb his heirs and assigns and of all and every other persons whatsoever, and Lastly the said John Tubb

A Deed of Lease and Release for seven hundred and Eighty nine acres of Land from Thomas Lewis to William Himmelwright, Acknowledged in open Court by the said Thomas Lewis and ordered to be Recorded.

This Indenture Made the Eighteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred and Eighty Eight, and of the Independence of the united States of America the twelfth. Between Thomas Lewis of the state of South Carolina and Greenville County (Clerk of the said County) of the one part, and William Himmelwright of the state of Pennsylvania, and City of Philadelphia (Cooper) of the other part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of ten shillings Sterling in hand well and truly paid by the said William Himmelwright to the said Thomas Lewis at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby Acknowledged by the said Thomas Lewis hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said William Himmelwright all that plantation or tract of land containing Six hundred and forty acres, being and lying in the County of Greenville aforesaid on horse creek a branch of Needy River, bounded on all sides on vacant land at the time of the original survey, also all that plantation or tract of land containing one hundred and forty nine acres, being and lying in the County of Greenville on horse creek aforesaid
