This Indenture made this twelfth day of June in the year of our Lord one Thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Eight and in the twelfth year of the Independence of the United States

of America Between William Tiller of Greenville county and State of South Carolina of the one part and Pleasant Hudson of the said county & State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty five pounds Sterling lawful money of said State in hand paid by Pleasant Hudson hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain sell and make over unto the said Pleasant Hudson a certain plantation or tract of land lying in Greenville county on both sides of Rocky Creek of Enoree River which the said Pleasant Hudson hath now possession of and hath such boundaries, whereas it was part of said Tiller's Land, all from his west line down said Creek to a line bearing one station black oak tree that stands on Francis Fullhorns north line thence running across to his north line all in that boundary fifty acres more or less he hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain sell and convey unto the said Pleasant Hudson the above described tract of land Together with the woods Waters Hereditaments and appurtenances unto said land belonging or in anywise appertaining and Reversion and Reversions Remainder and Remainders Rents Issues and profits thereof To have and to hold the granted premises of the above mentioned tract of land unto the said Pleasant Hudson his heirs Executors Administrators or assigns forever and that the said William Tiller his heirs Executors Administrators &c. Covenant and agree to and with the said Pleasant Hudson his heirs Executors Administrators or assigns shall at all times hereafter Peaceably and quietly Occupy possess and Enjoy the said tract of land from all former bargains sales mortgages Judgments Rights and Doweries and all other Incumbrances whatsoever, and the said William Tiller his heirs Executors Administrators or assigns from all and every other person or persons whatsoever that may lay any Claim or Title thereunto.
