
South Carolina Greenville County November the Seventeenth One thousand seven hundred and Eighty Eight. A Deed of conveyance for one hundred acres of land from William Weyer to Thomas Weyer. Acknowledged in open court by the said William Weyer and ordered to be recorded.

This Indenture made the tenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Eighty eight and of the thirteenth year of American Independence. Between William Weyer of the State of South Carolina and county of Greenville of the one part and Thomas Weyer of the State and county aforesaid of the other part. Wherein that in and by a certain grant bearing date the fifth day of June one thousand seven hundred and Eighty six under the hand of his Excellency William Moultrie Esquire Governor of the said State having the great Seal of the said State thereunto affixed did give and grant unto the said William Weyer a tract of three hundred and Ninety Eight acres of land situate in the county aforesaid on both sides of Clear creek of South Sugar River and hath such ~~shape~~ form and marks as are represented by a plat to

said grant annexed reference thereunto had may more fully appear. Now this Indenture Witnesseth that the said William Weyer for and in consideration of the sum of fifty pounds lawful money of the said State to him in hand well and truly paid by the said Thomas Weyer before the Sealing and Delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold aliened conveyed and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell alien convey and confirm unto the said Thomas Weyer one hundred acres (more or less) the same being part of the above described tract of three hundred and Ninety eight acres it being of the upper part of said tract and on the north side of said ~~stream~~ Creek beginning at a post oak corner to said survey above mentioned running with line of said survey South to a beechy on the said Creek thence down the Creek by its various courses to maple marked ~~XXX~~ thence North to the out line of said tract thence along said line to the beginning together with all the woods waters water courses ways Hereditaments unto the said tract belonging or in any wise appertaining and the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders rents Issues and profits thereunto belonging To have and to hold the said premises of one hundred acres more or less above mentioned unto the said Thomas Weyer his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Thomas Weyer his heirs and assigns forever the said tract of one acres more or less being in the possession of him the said Thomas Weyer and that the said William Weyer his heirs and assigns doth covenant and agree to and with the said Thomas Weyer his heirs and assigns that they shall at all times hereafter peaceably and quietly occupy possess and enjoy the said granted premises from all former bargains Sales Mortgages Judgments rights and all Incumbrances whatsoever and that the said William Weyer his heirs and Successors will warrant and forever defend the said tract above described unto the said Thomas Weyer his heirs and Successors forever from all and every other person or persons that shall lay claim thereunto Truly.
