hand of his Excellency William Moultrie Esq^r Governor &
commander in chief in and over the s^d State having the
great seal of the state thereunto affixed being for that purpose
appointed did give and Grant unto Joseph Langston a plan-
:tation or Tract of land containing six hundred and forty acres
situated and lying in Greenville County Ninety Six district
& on Langston's branch a branch of richland Creek & hath such
Forms & marks Bullings & boundings as appear by a plat
thereunto annexed which said plat and Grant being duly recorded
in the Secretary's Office Grant Book S.M.S. page 531 reference there-
:unto being had may more fully appear Now This Indenture Wit-
:nesseth that the said Joseph Langston & Ragland Langston for
and in consideration of the sum of forty pounds Current money
of this state to them in hand paid by the said Thomas Edwards
before the sealing and delivering of these presents the re-
:ceipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath Granted bargain-
:ed and sold and by these presents doth Grant bargain sell
and convey unto the said Thomas Edwards three hundred acres of
land out of the above described Grant of six hundred and
forty acres & hath marks & forms bulling & Boundings as are
herein after mentioned Beginning at a post oak near a pair
of race paths running from thence N. 36 E 300 poles to a stone
in center of a white oak red oak & Spanish oak from thence
S 60 E 140 poles to a post oak corner thence S 103 poles &
links to a stake corner at a road near a branch of richland
Creek thence up the s^d road 140 poles to a post oak being
Charles Allin's line thence along the said Allin's line (viz)
S 12 E 42 poles to a red oak, S. 16 E 48 poles to a Chestnut
