The following deed of Conveyance from Vachel Dillingham to
Thomas Cape was proven in Open Court May Term 1792 by the
oath of Elias Earle & ordered to be recorded which was done
this 6th day of August 1792.

This Indenture made this Twenty eighth day of
April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred &
ninety two between Vachel Dillingham of Greenville County
South Carolina of the one part & Thomas Cape of the County and
State aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth that the s^r. Vachel
Dillingham for and in consideration of the sum of Forty Pounds
Sterling to him in hand paid the receipt whereof he doth
herely acknowledge and thereof Exonerate & acquit the said
Thomas Cape his heirs &c. he the s^r. Vachel Dillingham hath
Granted bargained sold Enfeoffed conveyed & confirmed & by
these presents doth grant bargain sell alien Enfeoff Convey
& confirm unto the s^r. Thomas Cape his heirs &c. &c. a
Tract or parcel of land lying & being in the County aforesaid
on the waters of the North fork of Saluda river and bounded as
followeth Viz, Beginning at Elinor Jack corner white oak
marked thence running up a small Branch to an agreement line
marked by s^r. Dillingham & Cape thence on s^r. line to a red
oak on the little Beaver dam marked + thence on the said
Dillingham's line N 42 W 14 Ch^o. to a Spanish Oak & thence
N 30 E to a red oak & thence N 80 E to a white oak marked A
thence round a ridge on an agreement line to a white oak
