

171 The following Bill of Sale from John Wiley to Robert  
 Maxwell Esquire was produced in Open Court May 24<sup>th</sup>  
 Term 1792 & proven by the Oath of James Turley & Ordered  
 to be recorded which was done this 8<sup>th</sup> August 1792

KNOW all men by these presents that I John Wiley  
 of Greenville County & State of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina have this  
 day Bargained & sold to Robert Maxwell Esq<sup>r</sup> of  
 the County & State aforesaid, one certain Negro Girl  
 about Ten years old Cretty for the Valuable considera-  
 tion of thirty five pounds Current & Money of the State  
 aforesaid, which Negro Girl I do hereby warrant  
 & defend from all Bills, Bonds, debts, dues, demands,  
 Gifts Legacies, Mortgages, rights of dower, judgments  
 Executions, or Incumbrances whatsoever having  
 been had, made, or entered into before the sealing &  
 delivery of these presents In Witness whereof I have  
 hereunto set my hand & seal this 26<sup>th</sup> day of May 1792.
