

276 The following Deed of Conveyance from George Vaughn to James Blackstock being proven before Justice Tarrant Esquire was produced in Court at day Term of 98 and Ordered to be Recorded which was done this 11th Day of June 99

This Indenture made the Twenty second day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety one and in the fifteenth year of the Independence aforesaid Between George Vaughn of the County of Greenville State of South Carolina of the one part & James Blackstock of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said George Vaughn for the consideration of the sum of fifty pounds Sterling Money to him in hand paid by the said James Blackstock the receipt whereof the said George Vaughn doth hereby acknowledge he the said George Vaughn hath granted bargain sold aliened and conveyed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell aliened & confirmed unto James Blackstock his heirs & assigns for ever all that part of a Tract of Land situate lying on the waters of the Salceen River Creek Beginning on sower wood Line running N 75 W to a stake from thence S 40 W 46 chains to Black oak from thence S 77 E to Stake thence N 45 E 23 chains to post oak from thence S 68 E to Black Oak Corner from thence to the Beginning containing two hundred and Twenty four acres be the same more or less being part of a Tract of Land Granted to George Vaughn the 5th day June one thousand seven hundred and Eighty six and recorded in Secretarys Office in Charleston 11 page 11 reference being thereunto had may more fully appear Together with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging and also the reversions rents & services of the said premises & of every thereof & all Estate right & Title Interest claim & demand whatsoever from the said George Vaughn of in & to the said messuage & Tenements & premises & every part thereof to have & to hold the said plantation or Tract of Land & singular the said premises above mentioned and every part & parcel thereof unto James Blackstock his heirs & assigns for ever and the said George Vaughn for himself This being the said plantation or Tract of Two hundred & Twenty four acres of land be the same more or less and every part thereof against him and his heirs Claiming or to Claim any right Title Interest or demand from or under him the said George Vaughn to the
