286 The following Deed of Conveyance from Daniel Kelley to
William Stenson was produced in Court May Term 1798 and
proven by the Oath of Peter Foster and Ordered to be Re-
corded which was done this 19th day of June 1798
This Indenture made the ninth day of February and in the
year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety three
and in the seventeenth year of the Independence of the
United States Between Daniel Kelley of the County of Gran-
ville and State of South Carolina of the one part & William
Stenson of the County of State aforesaid of the other part
Witnesseth that the said Daniel Kelley for and in consi-
deration of the sum of fifty pounds Sterling to him in
hand paid the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge
hath granted bargained sold and by these presents doth
grant bargain and sell unto the said William Stenson
his heirs assigns all that plantation or Tract of land
containing one hundred acres be the same more or less
lying and being on the South fork of Solida river & bounded
as followeth Beginning at a white oak on the bank of the
said river Foster corner running thence 75 East to a white
oak thence N^o 49 W to a stake in the cane Brake line
