342 The following Deed of Conveyance from Samuel Earle Sen<sup>r</sup> to Samuel Earle Jun<sup>r</sup> was proven before George Salmon Esq<sup>r</sup> by the Oath of Hugh H. Bay and Recorded this 24<sup>th</sup> day of September 1793.

This Indenture made this Twenty first day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety three Between Samuel Earle Sen<sup>r</sup> of the State of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina Greenville County and Samuel Earle Jun<sup>r</sup> of the County & State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Samuel Earle Sen<sup>r</sup> for & in consideration of the sum one hundred & four pounds Sterling & Money to him in hand paid by the said Samuel Earle Jun<sup>r</sup> at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and with which he both acknowledge himself fully satisfied and paid, hath granted bargained and sold, and by these presents doth grant, Bargain, Sell unto the said Samuel Earle Jun<sup>r</sup> two hundred acres of land whereon Benjamin Baglin now lives, being a part of the following different Surveys, one made for Col<sup>l</sup> Henry Mather Wood, and one for Daniel Kelley, which said two hundred acres of Land is Bounded as Follows (Viz) Beginning on a Stake
