my pay or arrears of pay due my father as aforesaid  
for his said service as a continental soldier aforesaid  
from the United States or the State of South Carolina  
hereby Ratifying & confirming all that my said Attorney  
shall do in the business aforesaid and to give Receipts  
for the same and to do all lawful acts & things necessary or  
affecting the same as fully & absolutely to all intents &  
"purposes as I might or could do were I personally present  
at the office or elsewhere and done the same in Witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 11<sup>th</sup> day  
of October A<sup>d</sup> 1793

The following deed of Conveyance from Merry Hall to  
Reuben Copland being proven before John Alexander Esq.  
by the oath of Jeremiah Smith was was presented and  
Recorded this 21<sup>st</sup> day of October 1793.  
This Indenture made the 11<sup>th</sup> of April in the year  
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety three  
between Merry Hall of South Carolina and County of  
Greenville of the one part, & Reuben Coplin of the said State  
& County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Merry  
Hall for & in consideration of the sum of fifty pounds Sterling  
Money to him in hand paid by the said Reuben Coplin  
at and before the making & delivery of these presents the  
Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained
