The following Deed of Conveyance from William Hunt to  
James Brock being proven before John Thomas Esq. by the  
oath of David Brock was Recorded this 16<sup>th</sup> Day of Dec- 1793  
This Indenture made the 11<sup>th</sup> of February in the year of our  
Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety two and in the  
seventeenth year of Independency of the united States of  
America between William Hunt of the state of South Carolina  
and ninety six district of the one part and James Brock  
of the state & district aforesaid of the other part whereas in  
by a certain Grant bearing date the ninth day of November one  
thousand seven hundred and eighty six pass under the hand of  
his Excellency William Moultrie Esq. Governour the time being did  
give & Grant unto James Neely a tract of two hundred & fifty  
194 Eight Acres of land situate in the District of ninety six
