

of March in the year one thousand seven hundred & ninety four be
tween John Hunt of Greenville County & State of the one part, &
Lemuel James Alston of the S. County & State of the other part things
eth that the S. John Hunt for & in consideration of the sum of sixty
pounds to him in hand paid by the said Lemuel the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged hath sold unto the S. Lemuel his heirs & as-
signs for ever a certain tract of land containing one hundred and eighty
two acres more or less lying & being in the County aforesaid on the head
branches of Brushy Creek having such form & marks as a plot to the Ori-
ginal Grant (Signed by Thomas Pinckney the then Governor of this
State) represents Together with every advantage & privilege appertain-
ing thereunto to have & to hold the said tract of land with the appurten-
ances to the S. Lemuel his heirs & assigns, & that the S. John for himself
& his heirs shall and will warrant & for ever defend the aforesaid granted
premises to the said Lemuel his heirs and assigns for ever In witness
whereof the S. John Hunt hath hereunto set his hand & affixed his seal the
day and year first above written.

The following Deed of Conveyance from Benjamin Barton to George Bragg
being proven before Reuben Barrell Esq. by the oath of William Earley
was presented & recorded this 10th day of January 1795
This Indenture made this fourteenth day of October one thousand
seven hundred and ninety three, in the sixteenth year of American
Independence between Benjamin Barton of Pennington County & State
of South Carolina & Washington District of the one part & George Bragg
of Greenville County & District & State aforesaid of the other part who was
in & by a certain Grant bearing date the fifth day of January one
thousand seven hundred and eighty nine from under the hand of
his Excellency Thomas Pinckney Esq. Governor in & over the state
aforesaid did give and Grant unto the S. Benjamin Barton a cer-
tain tract or parcel of land containing sixty five acres be thereunto more
or less situated & lying & being on both sides of Bartons fork of the South
fork of Tygar River & has such shape form & marks as appears by plot
to S. Grant annexed the S. plot & Grant being duly Recorded in the
