Surveyed N. & S. on land then lately surveyed which said tract of two hundred acres of land was granted by his Excellency Benjamin Guisard Esquire Governor of the State aforesaid on or about the fifteenth day of October Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and eighty four to the said James King in fee simple butting and bounding having such shape form & Marks as are delineated & described in a plat to the Original Grant annexed Together with all & singular the houses, out houses, ices, trees, woods waters, water courses ways, paths passages profits commodities advantages, emblements hereditaments rights members & appurtenances whatsoever thereto belonging or in any wise appurtenanting and the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders, rents Issues & profits thereof to have and to hold the said parcel or tract of two hundred acres more or less of land with and singular other the premises hereby bargain and sold unto the said Henry Paris his heirs & Adm. and assigns from the day of the date hereof for & during & until the full end & term of one whole year from thence next ensuing and fully to be completed and ended yielding & paying therefor unto the said James King & Margaret King his wife at the expiration of the said term the rent of one peck of corn if lawfully demanded to the intent that by virtue of these presents and by force of the Statute for transferring us into possession the said Henry Paris may be in the actual possession of the premises and be lawfully enabled to accept and take a Grant and release of the reversion and inheritance thereof to him and his heirs for ever In witness whereof the said parties to these presents their hands & seals have hereunto interchangeably set on the day and in the year first above written mentioned the word David McHenry Read out and the name Henry Paris Intertined before Sealing & delivering James King

This Indenture made the nineteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred ninety five and in the nineteenth year of the Independence of the United States of North America between James King of Laurens County in the State of South Carolina aforesaid planter and Margaret King his wife of the one part and Henry Paris of the County of Greenville in the said State planter of the other part, Witnesseth that the said James King & Margaret King his wife in consideration of fifty five pounds lawful Sterling Money of the said State to the said James King his wife now in hand paid by the said Henry Paris have granted bargain and sold aliened released and confirmed, and by these presents do grant bargain & sell alien release and confirm unto the said Henry Paris in his actual possession now being by virtue of a bargain & sale to him thereof made by Indenture bearing date the nineteenth
