The following Deed of conveyance from John Gilbreath to
 Joab Sealds being proven before Reuben Barrett Esq^r by the
 oath of W. Savage was presented & Recorded this 25th January 1796

This Indenture made this 9th day of May in the year of
 our Lord one thousand seven hundred & Ninety five and in the
 nine tenth year of the American Independence between John
 Gilbreath of the one State of South Carolina & County of Green-
 ville Planter of the one part & Joab Sealds of the State & County
 aforesaid Planter of the other part witnesseth that the said
 John Gilbreath for & in consideration of the just & full sum of thirty
 Six pounds Selling to him in hand paid by the said Joab Sealds at or
 before the Sealing & Delivery of these presents the Receipt where of is
 here by acknowledged have given granted Bargained & Sold and by
 these presents Doth give Grant Bargain & Sell unto the said
 Sealds his heirs Executors admors. and assigns for ever in fee simple
 one hundred & twenty acres of land or the same more or less it being
 part of a tract of land of one hundred & twenty one acres granted to
 William Savage of D. tract where on D. John Gilbreath now lives the
 remaining part is one hundred & twenty acres Situate in the
 District of ninety Six on the waters of Enora River bounding on lines
 Running North east on John Savage S. E. on John twinn bough
 N. W. N. E. & S. W. on Vacant Land & hath such form & marks
 Bushings & boundings as are represented by a plat & grant the
 Seventh Day of May Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred
