The following deed of conveyance from John Stanford to Thomas Maxwell being proven before William Anderson Esq^r by the oath of James Butler was presented & recorded this 4th day of August A^d 1796
 This Indenture made this first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety five and in the nineteenth year of the American Independency between John Stanford of the County of Greenville & State of South Carolina & Washington District of the one part & Thomas Maxwell of the same place of the other part witnesseth that the s^d John Stanford for & in the consideration of the sum of fifty pounds Sterling Money to him in hand paid by the said Maxwell the receipt whereof he the said Stanford doth acknowledge himself fully satisfied & paid by these presents hath given granted bargained & sold aliened conveyed and confirmed unto him the said Thomas Maxwell two certain Tracts or parcels of land lying & being in the County of Greenville & State aforesaid on Finkenburris Beaver dam branch of the middle fork of Sugar River it being part of a tract of land granted to William Swift by his Excellency the Governor bearing date the sixth day of November in the year of our Lord 1706 and from him conveyed by deed to John Clayton & from Clayton to McDonald and now from Stanford to Maxwell begining at a Chesnut in the fork of the Ridge Road thence to a broken pine, thence to a split bush, thence to the head of the Spring enclosing them, thence down the branch to a marked red oak, thence to a marked black oak on the supposed line between Clayton & Swift, thence to a marked black oak on said line, thence to a marked black oak above the poplar Spring, thence crossing the branch above and below the Spring by a forked Chestnut, thence down the branch to a marked red oak on the creek side, thence down the creek opposite to a marked Hickory, thence to a marked pine, thence a straight line to Burks corner it being a black Jack, thence along a marked line to Swifts upper line to a marked post oak & Saplings, thence keeping said line to the Ridge Road, thence along the Ridge Road to the beginning corner containing by estimation one hundred acres more or less also one other tract adjoining the other granted to William Swift by a grant bearing date the sixth day of November in the year of our Lord 1706 under the hand of his Excellency William Stourley and from him conveyed by Deed to John Clayton & from said Clayton to John Stanford & from said Stanford to Thomas Maxwell begining at a pine near the Ridge Road Running thence to a Chesnut in the fork of the ridge Road, thence to a broken pine thence to a split bush thence to a Hickory, thence to a post oak, thence to the spring beam below the head of the Spring, thence down the branch to a red oak, thence
