The following Deed of Conveyance from Samuel Mosley to William
 Simpson being proven before Jesse Carter by the oath of Hugh Roach
 was presented and Recorded this 10th day of January 1797

This Indenture made this twenty first day of August in the year
 of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety six betwixt
 and between Samuel Mosley of Greenville County & State of South
 Carolina of the one part, & William Simpson of the said County
 & State of the other part witnesseth that the S^r. Samuel Mosley for
 an in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to him
 in hand well and truly paid by the S^r. William Simpson at & before
 the sealing and delivering of these premises the receipt whereof
 the S^r. Samuel Mosley doth hereby acknowledge and thereof & of
 and from every part and parcel thereof do acquit & discharge
 unto the S^r. William Simpson his heirs and assigns, and for
 divers other good causes and considerations hereunto moving
 have granted bargained & sold & confirmed unto the S^r. William
 Simpson his heirs & assigns for ever all that parcel or tract of
 Land lying and being in Greenville County, beginning on a red
 oak Mosley's corner on the East side of the big Road, thence run-
 ing alongest that line to a corner Spanish oak on Loughreages
 line, thence alongest said Mosley's & Loughreages line to a
 black oak, thence new lines alongest a black oak near Grove
 Road, from thence up the Grove Road to the beginning of Red
 oak it a part of a tract of land Originally granted to
 William Yarnall by his Excellency W^m. Montague for
