The following Deed of Conveyance from George Brock dit^o to Lun-
 ford Hudson being proven before John Thomas Jun^r Esq^r by the
 oath of Pleasant Hudson was presented & recorded this 20th Jan^y 1797
 This Indenture made this first day of November one thousand
 seven hundred and ninety two, and of the Independancy of the
 United States the seventeenth between George Brock S^r of the State
 of South Carolina and County of Greenville of the one part & Lunford
 Hudson of the County & State aforesaid of the other part witnesses
 for and in consideration of the sum of thirty five pounds Sterling
 lawful money of S^t. State in hand paid by Lunford Hudson hath
 bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain sell & make
 over unto S^r. Lun^d. Hudson a certain plantation or tract of Land lying
 in Greenville County on Rocky Creek of Enoree river which Isaac
 Brock now lives on and hath such boundaries whereas it begining
 on a post oak corner tree thence running S.W. to George Brock S^r. land
 to a stake thence long a certain line to a stake on George Brock S^r. N.E.
 line, and thence long S. line to post oak corner, from thence N.E. to the
 begining it being a part of a tract of land containing two hundred &
 fourteen acres granted unto Francis Fulcher from under the hand of his
 Excellency William Moultrie Esq^r bearing date the fourth day of Decem:
