 on a Beach St running S 60 W 19 chs Red oak St, thence N 30 W 66 chs  
 to arid oak St, thence N 60 E 11 chs to Sweet Gum St thence down the  
 meanders of Horse Creek to the begining being part of a Tract of four  
 hundred acres of land Originally granted to Mary Milling and  
 conveyed from John Means to the said Starling Camp To have  
 And to hold all and singular the premises above mentioned  
 with the rights members & appurtenances unto the same belonging  
 or in any wise appertaining unto the said John Camp his heirs &  
 assigns and I the said Starling Camp do hereby bind myself my  
 heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and for ever defend  
 the said Tract of one hundred acres of land (be the same more or less)  
 and all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said  
 John Camp his heirs and assigns against myself & my heirs and  
 every other person or persons whatsoever In witness whereof I have here

The following deed of Conveyance from Charles Lowell to Richard  
 Lowell being proven before Robert M. C. Jee Esq<sup>r</sup>: by the oath of James  
 Baynes was presented and recorded this 13<sup>th</sup> day of June 1797  
 This Indenture made the first day of May in the year of our Lord  
 one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven between Charles Lowell  
 of Greenville County in the State of South Carolina of the one part, and  
 Richard Lowell of the County and State aforesaid of the other part, witness  
 that the said Charles Lowell for and in consideration of the sum of ten  
 pounds Sterling money of the said State to him in hand well and Truly  
 paid by the said Richard Lowell at and before the sealing & delivery of these  
 presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained  
 and sold and by these presents doth bargain sell and make over unto the  
 said Richard Lowell a certain plantation or tract of land containing eighty  
 acres lying in Greenville County on Drushey Creek of Enore River & including  
 the plantation on which the said Charles Lowell now lives & bounded by  
 those parts sold to John Thomas Junior and Benjamin Wall by Reuben Smith
