

The following Bill of Sale from Henry Hopson to Joseph Benson being proven before Thomas Edwards Esq^r by the oath of Willis Benson was presented and Recorded this 9th of April A^d 1798
 Know all men by these presents that I Henry Hopson Sr. of the S^t of S. Carolina and Greenville County have bargained sold and delivered unto Joseph Benson one Negro Man named Sam and one Negro Boy named Billy for the consideration of four hundred dollars to me in hand paid by the said Joseph Benson the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, also have sold to the s^d Benson one Sorel Horse called Ball, one Bay Horse called Page, and one feather Bed and furniture for the consideration of two hundred dollars to me in hand paid by the said Benson, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and the s^d Henry Hopson will warrant to him the said Benson the above mentioned property, free and clear from me my heirs and from all and every person or persons whatsoever laying any claim title or demand to it, In witness of the same I have hereunto set my hand & seal this Sixth day of April 1798. The following Act of Conveyance from Jolton Woody to William Thurston being proven before John Tule Esq^r by the oath of Thomas Hooper was presented and recorded this 10th day of April 1798
 This Indenture made this Eleventh day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven Between Jolton Woody of the County of Greenville & State of South Carolina of the one part & William Thurston of the County & State afores^d of the other part well & neatly that the said Jolton Woody for and in consideration of the sum of seventy pounds Sterling in hand paid to the s^d Jolton Woody by the s^d William Thurston before the signing & delivery hereof the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the afores^d Jolton Woody ^{part} ~~has~~ bargained sold & conveyed unto the before mentioned William Thurston a certain tract of Land containing one Hundred Acres More or Less & situated in Greenville County & State afores^d one Branch of Saluda River being a tract of Land whereon the said Jolton Woody now lives being & bounding Southward by or Lands laid out for Joseph Bridges now claimed by Henry Gray & Northward one Land laid out for the s^d Benson now claimed by Ch^s Benson & Westward on a condition
