

The following Deed of Conveyance from Robert Gilliland to
 Valentine Harbin being Proven before Larkin Tarrant
 Esquire by the oath of John Huel was Printed and Recd
 this 6th day of October 1800

This Indenture made this 16th day of March One thousand
 seven hundred and ninety three and in the seven tenth year of
 the Independence of America between Robert Gilliland of
 the County of Greeneville and State of South Carolina
 of the one Part and Valentine Harbin of the County and
 State aforesaid of the Other Part Witness that the
 said Robert Gilliland for and in consideration of the
 sum of Sixty Pounds law full Sterling Money to him in
 hand well and truly Paid by the said Valentine Harbin
 at and before the sealing and delivery of these Presents
 the Receipt whereof the said Robert Gilliland doth here
 by Acknowledge and there of and of and from every part
 and Parcel thereof do acquit and discharge the said
 Valentine Harbin his Heirs and assigns and for all his
 other good causes and considerations hereunto moving have
 bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain
 Sell alien Enfeoff and confirm unto the unto the said
 Valentine Harbin his heirs and assigns forever all that
 parcel or tract of Land lying and being in Greeneville
 County on the Needy fork waters of Needy River contain-
 ing two hundred acres Originally granted unto the said
 Robert Gilliland and signed by his Esquire William
 Monttrie the fifth day of June in the year of our Lord
 One thousand seven hundred and Eighty six as by a plat
