presents that I Joseph Maxwell of Bunham County  
State of North Carolina in consideration of the sum of  
Fifty five Dollars to me paid by John Thomas Hunt  
of Greenville County State of South Carolina aforesaid  
have granted bargained sold and Released by these pre-  
sents do grant bargain sell and Release unto the  
John Thomas Hunt a Plantation or parcel of Land contain-  
ing One hundred and three acres situated in Greenville  
County aforesaid on both sides of Thompsons Branch  
Creek of Tygar River Beginning at a Post Oak N<sup>o</sup> 25<sup>o</sup> 41'  
28 ch<sup>o</sup> to a red Oak thence S<sup>o</sup> 65<sup>o</sup> W<sup>o</sup> 37 ch<sup>o</sup> to a  
chestnut thence S<sup>o</sup> 25<sup>o</sup> E<sup>o</sup> 28 ch<sup>o</sup> to a stake thence S<sup>o</sup>  
65<sup>o</sup> E<sup>o</sup> 37 ch<sup>o</sup> to the beginning Granted by patent 6
