

The following ~~Indenture~~ from James Barton to David M. David being proven before B. Griffith Esquire by th<sup>o</sup> of William Hamby was presented and recorded this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of April 1881

This Indenture made the eight of October One thousand seven hundred and ninety and in the fourteenth year of American Independance between James Barton of the State of South Carolina, Greenville County of the one part and David M. David of the State and county aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said James Barton for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty five pounds Sterling to him in hand paid by the said David M. David the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged he the said James Barton hath bargained, sold and by these presents doth bargain & sell all that plantation or tract of one hundred acres of land being a part of a tract of six hundred and forty acres Originally granted unto John Rodman by patent bearing date the twenty fifth day of January One thousand seven hundred and eighty five lying and being on a creek called Durbins Creek in State aforesaid & District of ninety six now called Greenville County, recorded in the secretaries Office in Book @@@@ page 495 reference there unto had more fully appears the same now intended to be thus conveyed being a part of the said Tract of six hundred and forty acres lying on the north side of the main branch of the said Creek beginning a maple on the said Creek & runs thence North fifteen Degrees east with the said line of 640 acres to a post Oak thence South seventy five degrees east
