 Presents that I Icham Clayton of Franklin County & State of Georgia
 in Consideration of Fifteen Hundred dollars to me paid by Wellington
 Carley of Greenville District and State of South Carolina, Have
 granted, bargained, sold and released and by these "Presents" do
 grant bargain sell & release unto the s^d Wellington Carley all
 that Plantation or Tract of Land containing two hundred &
 fifty acres, situate in Greenville District, bounded to the S.W.
 on Saluda River to the N.W. on S. River bounding all sides at
 the time of survey on vacant Land the said tract was granted to
 Timothy Loney by his excellency Gov. Gerard on the 15th day of
 May 1784 - beginning on a black gum, running N. 35 E. 12, 30 to a
 post oak, thence S 55 E 50 Ch^s to a stake, from thence to a black oak
 corner on the river, also see other tract containing two hundred and
 twenty five acres, granted to Dan^l Bush by his excellency William
 Moultrie the 17th day of May 1785. beginning on a black gum &
 running N. 35 E. 10. 50 to a post oak, thence S 55 E 38 to a pine thence
 N 35 E 36 60 to a red oak, thence S 68 E. 14, 60 to a white oak.
