Wood of the District of Greenville in the State of aforesaid in consideration of Twelve hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by George W. Earle of the same place, Have granted, bargained sold & released, and by these Presents Doth grant bargain sell & release unto the said George W. Earle All that parcel or tract of Land containing Three hundred acres (being a part of two Surveys one originally granted to Baylis Earle Junr & one to William Gilis) lying in the District aforesaid on the North side of Needy River, known by the name of the Pigeon Roost, beginning on a red oak near the bank of the River, running thence North sixty six degrees East fifteen Ch: to a Stake thence North eighty two degrees East thirteen Ch: & 50 links to a Stake, near the road, thence North thirty degrees East sixty two Chains & 75 links to a post oak, thence North sixty six degrees West forty one Ch: & 40 links to a post oak, thence South thirty degrees West Sixty eight Chains & 50 links to a Stake, on the bank of the river thence with the Meanders of said River to the beginning; To contain three hundred acres, together with all singular the Rights Members hereditaments & appurtenances, to the
