Containing four ten acres — Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining: To have and to hold all and singular the premises unto the s^d. John Robinson his heirs and assigns for ever. & I do hereby bind myself my heirs & c. to warrant & for ever defend all & singular the premises unto the said John Robinson his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and every other person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
