 that tract or parcel of land containing two hundred acres lying and  
 being in the said District of Greenville on both sides of the South fork  
 of Brushy Creek a branch of Peachy River, beginning at a red Oak  
 thence S 20 E 33 Ch. to a post Oak, thence S 70 W 18 Ch. to a post Oak  
 thence S 20 E 20 Ch. to a red Oak thence N 70 E 55 Ch. to red Oak  
 thence N 30 W 59 Ch. to a stake, and thence S 70 W 26 Ch. to the  
 beginning, as appears from a Plat annexed to the Great bearing date  
 the fourth day of July A.D. One thousand seven hundred & eighty  
 five made out in the name of Matthew Lowry as Grantor -  
 Together with all and singular the Right, number, hereditaments  
 and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise  
 appertaining; To have and to hold all and singular the premises  
 before mentioned unto the said Samuel Samuel Atton his heirs
