

I Daniel Wilbanks of Greenville District in the State aforesaid  
Carpenter in consideration of One hundred and twenty dollars  
to me in hand paid by Joseph Thompson Settlor of the same place  
Have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents  
Do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Joseph T.  
Matthew all that Tract or parcel of Land Containing by estimation  
two hundred and nineteen acres, being part of a Tract of Land  
originally granted to Austin Clayton the first day of July 1792.  
Conveyed from William Stanford to Pleasant Casley and so  
from him to me. Situate in the District aforesaid on Ten-  
tenberry's Beaver Dam Creek on both sides of the wild Cat  
Branch, beginning on a Sycamore Stake on land laid out
