Witnesseth that the said Nathaniel Gentry for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty Pounds Sterling money to him in hand paid by Charles Whitten the receipt whereof the said Nathaniel Gentry doth hereby acknowledge and himself therewith fully satisfied and Paid HATH granted bargained sold ~~and~~ conveyed and confirmed, by these presents doth fully truly clearly & absolutely grant bargain sell convey and confirm unto the said Charles Whitten his heirs and assigns for ever, a tract or parcel of Land containing Four hundred & forty four acres lying and being in the County of Greenville aforesaid on Jamison, mill creek of South Piedmont River. Beginning at a black gum N. 48 to a Oak, S. 78. Small pine 3+. N. 28 to a Chestnut 3+. N. 90 N. 28 to a Oak, N. 62 E. 25 to a Small White Pine 3+ on the mountain side N. 20 E. 7. N. 6 to a Chestnut 34 on said Mountain N. 40 E. 12. Sp. Oak 34 S. Mountain, N. 80 E. 27 Stick by a Rock 34 S. 70 E. 39 to a Stake 3+ S. 10 E. 61 to a Conditional line. It was granted to the said Nathaniel Gentry by Patent from the State aforesaid. Dated 4th day of February 1793. Together with all Woods Waters Mines Minerals Hereditaments & appurtenances to the said Land belonging or appertaining & all the whole Right Title and Estate of the said Nathaniel Gentry into the said Land & premises: To have and to hold for ever the said granted & bargained premises with all the appurtenances and privileges therunto belonging in any ways appertaining to him the said Charles Whitten his heirs & assigns for ever to his and their only proper use ^{benefit} and behoof for ever & the said Nathaniel Gentry for himself his heirs Executors & Adm^r doth covenant promise & agree to & with the said Charles Whitten that the said Charles Whitten his heirs and assigns shall and may at all times for ever hereafter Lawfully and peaceably possess and enjoy the aforesaid Land with all the appurtenances free and clear from all incumbrances & Claims whatsoever and that the said Nathaniel Gentry his heirs Executors & Adm^r the aforesaid Land with all the appurtenances unto him the said Charles Whitten his heirs and assigns will well & truly warrant & for ever defend.
