of age which Negro I warrant and defend unto John Blasingame  
his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs & all & every other  
person whatsoever. Witness my hand, day & date above written

duly sworn, maketh oath that he saw Blackman Ligon, sign &  
deliver the within Bill of Sale for the use and purpose  
therein mentioned, and that William Anderson was a sub-

The State of South Carolina Greenville District. Know all men  
by these presents that I William Walton of the State of North Carolina  
& County of Rutherford do and in consideration of four hundred &  
Fifty dollars to me in hand paid by Thomas Edwards of Greenville  
District & State of S. Carolina, have granted, bargained and sold, &  
by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said  
Thomas Edwards, all that Tracts or Tracts of lands situate being &  
lying in Greenville District & State of South Carolina, where Edwin  
Lunsford commonly known, which land was granted to John Snoddy  
& Robert Prince and bounded as followeth, Beginning on a Black Oak  
running thence N 55 W 44 ch. 72. to a white oak, thence N 55 E 44 ch  
72. to a Stake, thence E. 50. ch. to a Stake, thence S 5 W. 69 ch. to the  
beginning. Containing two hundred and forty acres more or less. the  
Grant bearing date the first day of August One thousand seven  
hundred and Eighty five from under the hand of his Excellency  
W<sup>m</sup> Moultrie. Also one other Tract or Parcel of land Containing  
Ten Acres adjoining the former Tract, whereon the dwelling house  
now stands it being part of a <sup>large</sup> Tract of four thousand acres, & granted  
to Robert Prince by his excellency Tho. Pinckney, bearing date  
the seventh day of March One thousand seven hundred & Eighty  
Eight, which land was conveyed from Prince to M. Day, from  
M. Day to Isaac Wilkins, from Wilkins, to Edwin Lunsford &  
from
