

The State of South Carolina. Know all men by these Presents that I the undersigned
 Sen^r of the State above mentioned and district of Greenville for the sum of twelve hundred
 dollars paid by John H. Harrison of the district and State above mentioned the receipt
 whereof is hereby fully acknowledged have granted bargained, sold and released
 delivered, and by these Presents do grant bargain sell and deliver to the said John
 H. Harrison his heirs and assigns to his or their proper use and behoof all that
 Plantation or Tract of Land on which I now live in the State and district aforesaid
 on the North East side of Reedy River being part of a Tract originally granted to
 me by his excellency Ben. Guardo on the 18th day of October in the year of our Lord
 1784 for six hundred and forty acres. Beginning on Reedy River where the old
 Indian Boundary line crosses the same, on the lower Square, thence S. E. 66^o
 30 ch. to a dogwood on land occupied by John Baker, thence N. E. 24^o 30 ch
 to a red oak 3⁺ thence N. W. 66^o 30 to a stake 3⁺ on land laid out to Genl.
 Richard Winn, now occupied by James Harrison Sen^r. thence S. W. 24^o 40 ch
 to Reedy River, thence down the Middle of said River with its meanders
 to the beginning: Also all that part of a Tract granted to Owen Jenkins, lying
 on the North East side of Reedy River conveyed by the said Owen to me —
 supposed in the whole to contain five hundred and fifty acres. be the same
 more or less. a description of which premises will more fully appear by
 having recourse to plots to the original Grants annexed. Together
