That I Alexander Waddill of the District aforesaid for and in consideration  
of the sum of two hundred and ninety five Dollars to me in hand paid  
by Richard Lewis Wilkinson of the said District Have granted bargained  
sold and released unto the said Richard Lewis Wilkinson a certain parcel or  
tract of Land which I bought of Nathaniel Stokes (Being part of a tract  
of four Hundred and Seventy three Acres Originally granted to John  
Timmons and bearing Date 15<sup>th</sup> October 1784 and by him conveyed to the  
said Nathaniel Stokes by deed) containing seventy four Acres more or less  
Beginning at the branch on the lower line at a stake thence S. 45.  
W. 83<sup>o</sup> Chain to a stake corner within the same ground thence N. 60. W.  
24. chain 50 Links to a small black Oak on Attons line then N. 10. E. 70.  
chain to a Persimmon Tree at the said branch near James Rutleys old  
path to the Courthouse, then down said branch to the Beginning  
Together with all the rights and appurtenances belonging thereto -  
To Have and to hold unto the said Richard Lewis Wilkinson his heirs and  
Assigns forever And I do hereby bind myself my Heirs Executors &c. to war-  
rant and defend forever the said plantation or tract of Land of seventy  
four Acres unto the said Richard L. Wilkinson his heirs & assigns &  
Against myself my heirs & every other person or persons claiming the same  
or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this 28<sup>th</sup> September 1804  
on the thirtieth Year of the Common Wealth. Signed in the presence of  
G. S. Earle W. G. Handwork } Alexander Waddill
