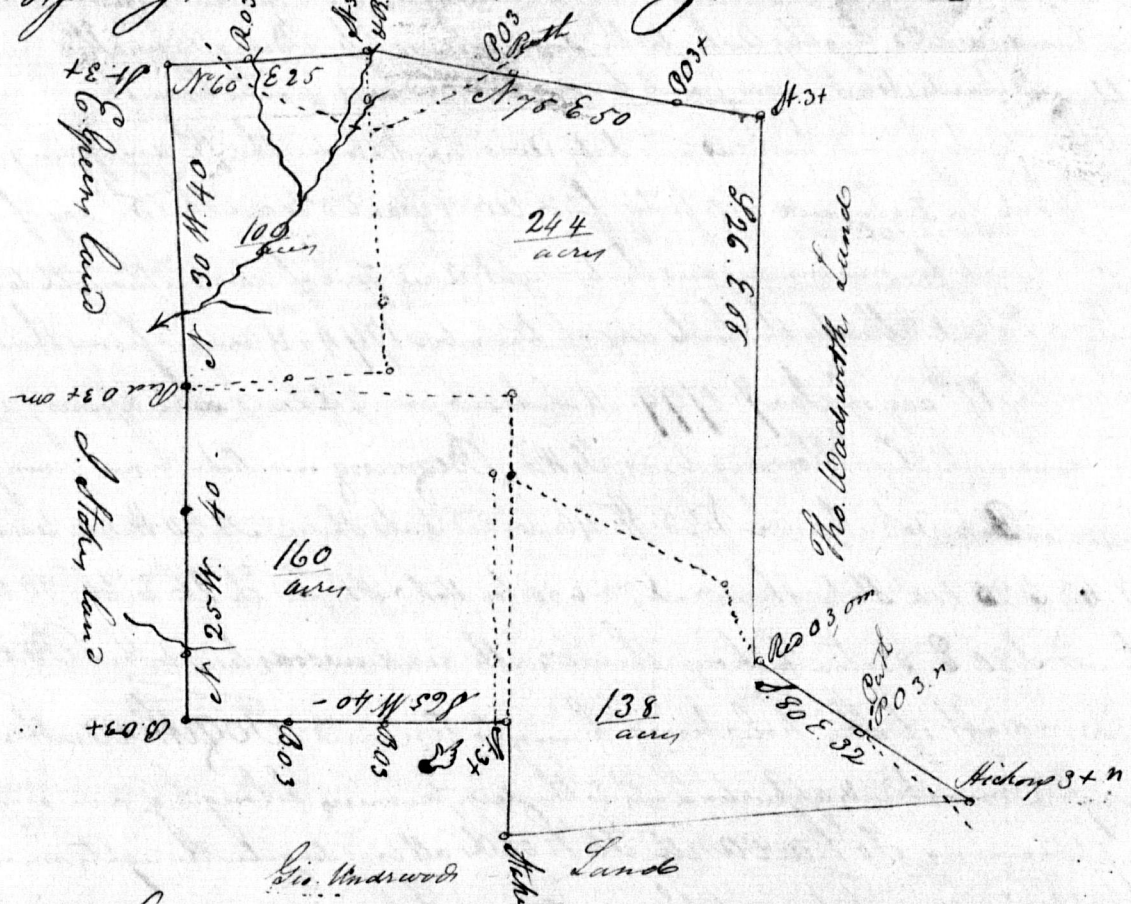

 James Fowler of Spartanburg County in consideration of the sum of fifty
 Pounds to me paid by James Green of Greenville County, have granted
 bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell & release
 unto the s^d James Green a plantation or tract of Land laying & being in
 Greenville County on Quins Creek of South Carolina River, beginning on a history
 of Camels Survey on the West side of the Creek, running thence S. 30. E. 7. ch. 20. 1/2
 to a chestnut Thence S. 28. E. 10. ch. 25. Lk. to a stake (on an Aqua line) Thence
 N. 60. E. 25. ch. to a chestnut (crossing Quins Creek) Thence N. 30. W. 10 ch.
 25. Lk. to a chestnut Thence Maxwell's corner, thence N. 70 W. 12 1/2 ch. 25 Lk. to
 a black Oak Thence N. 35 W. 25 ch. to a chestnut Oak Thence S. 55. W. (
 crossing the creek) 25 ch. to a stake, thence to the beginning containing by
 Estimation Ninety eight Acres to the same more or less being parts of three
 tracts or parts of Land one tract surveyed for Duncan Campbell & patent
 bearing date 15th day of June 1780 & a part of the same sold & conveyed by him
 to Joseph Maxwell & by said Maxwell conveyed to James Fowler on other tract
 surveyed for Tho. Maxwell & patent bearing date 7th April 1788 adjoining
 the above & part of the same sold & conveyed by him to Joseph Maxwell
