W. 80° 44.72 to the Beginning - The second beginning on a red oak corner running thence N. 10° E. 24.22 to a post oak thence S. 80° E. 27. to a stake thence N. 10° E. 5.75 to a stake thence N. 80. W. 10. to a pine thence N. 40° E. 25. to a red oak, thence N. 82° W. 34. to a post oak thence S. 20. W. 38.40 to a post oak thence S. 30° E. 17 to the Beginning containing one hundred acres - Together with all & singular the rights, members, hereditaments & appurtenances belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, To have and to hold all the singulars the said premises unto the said John Stokes his heirs & assigns forever, and do hereby bind myself my heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all & singulars the premises before mentioned unto the said John Stokes his heirs & assigns Against my self & my heirs & against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. The State of South Carolina, I know all manner by these presents that I, Eunice Stokes, <sup>do</sup> of Greenville District in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of Four Hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by John Stokes of the same place <sup>have</sup> Granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents do Grant, bargain sell and Release unto the said John Stokes all that Plantation tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and five acres, to the same more or less situate lying and being in the district of Greenville on Reedy River, bounded by a line running S. W. by Elisha Gun's Land S. E. by Col. Atton's N. E. by <sup>Col.</sup> Stokes and Reedy River, being part of a tract of 640 Acres originally granted to William Brandon the 10<sup>th</sup> day of October 1784, and by said William Brandon conveyed to the said Eunice Stokes the 23<sup>rd</sup> of December 1788. The part now to be conveyed begins on a Stake corner near the River on the originally line thence with said line S. 60° W. 43 chains to a red oak & the original corner thence with the original line S. 30° E. 31.50. to a stake corner 3 ft. thence N. 62° E. 25 chains to a black gum on Reedy River thence up the various meanders of said river to the Beginning together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, To have and to Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said John Stokes his heirs & assigns forever AND I do hereby bind myself my heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said John Stokes his heirs & assigns Against my self & my heirs and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
