 Released unto the said Hewlet Sullivan all that tract of land or plantation (whom the said Brown  
 now lives) containing three hundred and forty acres be the same more or less. Situate in the State and  
 District aforesaid on Horse creek of Ready River. Beginning on a sweet gum st. on the said creek  
 thence running up the spring branch with its meanders to a Sowerwood st. adjoining Hudson Berry  
 land, thence running S. 20<sup>o</sup> to a post oak st. thence running S. E. 85: 19<sup>o</sup> to a stake st. thence  
 running S. E. 19: 50<sup>o</sup> to a stake st. thence running S. 85: E. 47<sup>o</sup> to a post oak st. thence running N. 5:  
 & 24<sup>o</sup> to a stake st. thence running N. 53: W. 81<sup>o</sup> to a dogwood st. thence running N. 0: E. 31<sup>o</sup> to a red oak  
 3x. thence running N. 75: E. 25<sup>o</sup> to a white oak st. thence running N. 10: E. 19<sup>o</sup> to a hickory st.

 heirs and every other Person whatsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part  
 thereof. adjoining John Chandler on the west & Wm. Mulligan on the south & Benj<sup>n</sup> Townsen  
 on the east and said Sullivan on the north East & Hudson Berry on the north West
