This Indenture made this seventh day of June in the year of our Lord <sup>425</sup> one thousand  
 Eight hundred and six, between William M. Clure of Greenville district & the State of  
 South Carolina of the one part, & Thomas Butler of the county of Buncombe State of  
 North Carolina of the other part. Witnesseth that for and in consideration of sum of  
 more than one thousand dollars Lawfull money of said State to me in hand paid before the inscaling  
 and delivering of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, Nath Grant  
 bargained sold conveyed and confirmed unto the said Thomas Butler his heirs Executors  
 Administrators or assigns all and singular that tract and parcel of land, lying and being  
 Situate in the county of Greenville on both sides of Rock creek the waters of Greenriver  
 and beginning at a white Oak Running N. 15. W. 19. 16. to a pine thence N. 85. W. 9. to  
 a hickory thence N. 20. W. 20. 50. to a pine thence N. 86. W. 30. 00. to a large poplar thence  
 S. 16. 25. to a chestnut, thence S. 29. W. 27. to a Stake thence S. 86. E. 48. 00. to a Stake  
 thence N. 65. E. 20. 50 to the Beginning, as appears by a plat annexed to the Original.  
 Patent granted to John Childers from under the hand of his Excellency Thomas Pinckney  
 Esq. our Governor Commanded in chief in and over said State at the time, being  
 bearing date the seventh of May one thousand Seven hundred & Eighty Seven, & in the Eleventh  
 (Year)
