Stokes all that Piece Parcel or tract of land containing two hundred acres be the same more or less. Situate in Greenville District on Laurell creek waters of Reedy river, Beginning on a box oak N. 65. E. 50. 00 to a stake N. 25. W. 50. 00. thence to a white oak South 55. W. 50. 00. to a black Sack thence to the Beginning corner, South 25. E. 50. 00. Bounded on all sides by vacant lands when laid out or generally granted to Samuel Dunlap deceased & the said Samuel Dunlap by his last will & testament did & bequeath the said tract of Land containing two hundred acres as aforesaid, unto the said Susannah Dunlap & Catharine Dunlap now the wife of the said William Donough to be Equally divided between them Susannah Dunlap and Catharine Dunlap the Present wife of the said William Donough as by a reference to the last will & Testament will more fully and at large appear.
