

District of Greenville and State aforesaid, of the other part Witnespeth that the said Jonathan Johnson attorney for John Johnson of Charleston aforesaid for and in Consideration of the sum of four hundred and Eighty Dollars to me in hand paid by Elisha Green of the District of Greenville in the State aforesaid, Have bargained and sold, and Released, and by these presents Do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Elisha Green aforesaid, all that plantation or tract of land containing three hundred and twenty acres, situate being and lying in the District of Greenville on the waters of Richland creek, a branch of Needy River, Beginning at a black oak running S. 6. 30. 32. to a red oak or thence N. 8. 60. 80. to a stake from thence N. W. 34. 5 2. to a stake from thence S. W. 45. 80. to the Beginning as may more fully appear reference being had to the original grant, which Land was on the fourth day of April one thousand seven hundred and Eighty five, granted by His Excellency William Moultrie to the said John Johnson, Together with all and singular the Premises Rights members Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Land. Belonging or in any wise Incident or appertaining To Have and To Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Elisha Green his heirs, Executors, and administrators and assigns. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs, and assigns, Executors and administrators as the aforesaid John Johnson attorney to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said Premises unto the said Elisha Green his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and against the said John Johnson his heirs and assigns, and against Every Person whomsoever Lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof - In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the fourteenth day of April Anno Domini 1807 - Done in Presence of us.
