and district aforesaid the Receipt is hereby acknowledged, Have granted bargained
and sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said
William Cox his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land containing
one hundred acres more or less, situated in the district aforesaid, on Spriggs Branch
waters of Chubasco River, of Saluda River, including an improvement made by
David Mash bounded by Joshua Williams Land and by George Salmons Land
Beginning on a red oak in s^d Salmons line running thence a conventional line to a
hickory thence to a poplar on the branch thence to W^m Cox line thro the out line
of the furrow thence with the original line to the Beginning, & being part of
a tract of Five hundred acres granted to George Salmon in the year of our Lord
one thousand seven hundred and ninety three containing one hundred acres
more or less, Together with all and singular the wrights, members, Hereditaments,
and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining
