This indenture made this the second day of February one thousand Eight hundred &
 seven. Between John Harrison of the one part of the St. of S. Carolina & the district of
 Greenville, and James Bridges of the same State & Dist. aforesaid of the other part
 Witness that the said John Harrison for and in consideration of the sum of
 two hundred dollars to him paid in hand by the s^r. James Bridges the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged, & the s^r. John Harrison have granted bargained
 and sold unto the s^r. James Bridges part of two tracts of land lying on the south
 side of reedy river, one hundred acres originally granted to Joseph Box the
 twenty first day of January one thousand seven hundred & eighty five, by His
 Excellency Benjamin Gerard Esq. Governor for him did give & grant unto
 Joseph Box a tract of land containing four hundred acres, and fully lying
 and joining the same originally granted to David Brown by His Excellency
 William Moultrie Esq. on the fourth day of December one thousand seven hundred
 and eighty six, Situate in the dist. of Greenville and such form & marks as appear
 by a plat to the s^r. granty it being laid out on the south side of reedy river
 Beginning on one of the head branches of armstrongs creek thence down said
 branch to where the original line corner, down said branch the original
