delivered unto friend Thomas Benson his heirs and representatives in trust for
the only use and behoof of my beloved Wife Jenny Chambers, all & singular
the Estate which I am now in possession of consisting of Land, Stocks, of Cattle horses,
Plantation utensils, household and kitchen furniture also hogs sheep Geese
Poultry of every kind, all the corn fodder & every thing I am now in possession
of, To have and To hold the above Estate for the use and benefit of my wife Jenny
Chambers without the hindrance ^{or molestation} of one or any other persons or persons, during
her natural life & at her death I mean my wife Jenny Chambers that she
shall be at liberty to dispose of it as she may see cause and that it may be clearly
understood I mean that my whole Estate shall be and to belong to her during her
life and to dispose of as she may see cause — Given under my hand and
seal this 25th November 1807 — Done in presence of
