his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs, Executors & adm^{rs} to warrant
and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Tho^s Benson his heirs
and assigns against myself and my heirs and against every other person whomsoever
lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof - Witness my hand and
seal this fifth day of March one thousand Eight hundred and Eight, and of the
Independence of America the 32nd and 33rd year - Signed sealed and delivered in
the presence of us -

persons ever claiming the same, untill I pay said Terry the above ninety five
dollars, In Witness whereof I have set my hand this 8th day of October
