Know all men by these presents that I Arthur Clark of the State and district above mentioned of the one part and John Corr of the other part -

Witnesseth that the said Arthur Clark Have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the sd John Corr, all that part of a certain tract of land containing 1823 acres originally granted to Miles Jennings by his excellency William Moultrie on the third day of April 1780. being on the water, of Saluda River as by a plat therunto annexed will there appear Beginning at a white oak in the fork of a branch running S.W. 75. to a stake on the original line, thence S.E. 10. chains on the old line 14. to a white oak, near a branch thence S.E. and 10 chains to a pine oak corner thence S.E. 50. on the old line 30 chains on the old road leading from Piercey ford Saluda to the tumbling Shoals reedy river at a fork of the branch thence up the branch the beginning white oak containing 100 acres more or less, together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to the said Premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To Have & To Hold all and singular the Premises before mentioned unto the said John Corr his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said Premises unto the said John Corr his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs, and against every Person whomsoever lawfully claims or to claim the same or any part thereof. As Witness my hand and seal this 19th day of November 1805. and in the 28th year of the Sovereignty and independence of the United States of America
