 Greenville District, and State of South Carolina, in consideration of the sum of three
 hundred dollars to me paid by John Lucas of the District aforesaid, I have granted
 bargained sold & released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and
 release unto the said John Lucas a plantation or tract of land lying in Greenville
 district on wild cat Creek of Goose Tygar river, and a branch of Eliza Thompson
 Creek, called the beaver dam of middle Tygar, bounding by line running N.E.
 N.W. by land Surveyed S. Shaw M^t 48^o by Ann Smith S.M. by land Surveyed M.
 Brogden all other vacant land, Beginning on a post oak running South 29:
 30: to a Stake thence S 75 W 38: 20. to a chestnut thence North - to a chestnut
 agreed corner by said Gray & Robert Carter a strait course across the Creek to
 a red oak, agreed corner, thence to a Stake on the old line thence along the
 old line to a B.O. corner thence E. 20 W. 22: 50 to a hickory thence N. 55 E 37: 10
 to a red oak, thence a straight course to the head of a small branch thence
 down the said branch to a forked Poplar to hold the water from there to a
 gum corner of said land, thence W. 38: 00. to the Beginning corner -
 by estimation two hundred acres more or less, the same being land granted to
 the said Gray by a Patten bearing date the eighteenth day of January 1790
 together with all and singular the right, members hereditaments and
 appurtenance to the said premises, belonging or in any wise appertaining -
 To have & to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said
 John Lucas his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my he^r
 Executors adm^r to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said
 premises unto the said John Lucas his heirs forever, ag^t myself & my heirs and
 against all and every other person lawfully claiming or to claim the same
