sd Brown a tract or parcel of Land containing by Estimation Six hundred acres
to the same more or less. Beginning at a post oak running thence N. 10° E. 42
Chain to a post oak thence 82° E. 13 chain to a sed oak, thence N. 12° E. 23 chain
25 fms to a lightwood, near y on Robt Goodgony corner on the st. side of the
Charleston Road thence S. 88° E. with Goodgony line 29. ch. 50 lls. to a red oak
thence N. 66° E. 25 Chain 50 lls. to a red oak near Mollocos Creek, thence N. 66°
E. 13 ch. 40 lls. (across the creek) to a red oak thence S. 66° E. 11 ch. 50 lls. to a blks oak
on the ancient Indian Boundary line, thence S. with said line crossing the creek
127 ch. to a post oak (Varnons corner) (crossing the Charleston road) thence S. 56°
